Male Circumcision: Saving Lives in Kenya

In this 15-minute documentary, Kenyans describe the role of safe and voluntary male circumcision in their efforts to prevent the spread of HIV infection. Government officials explain why they offer the procedure as part of a comprehensive package of HIV prevention services. Men and their wives recount their own experiences and discuss why they chose male circumcision to help protect themselves from HIV.

This document provides guidance to help programmes make their clinical and surgical activities more efficient so that they can meet the demand for male circumcision services in a variety of healthcare settings.

At the Cutting Edge: Delivering Male Circumcision through Marie Stopes' Reproductive Health Mobile Outreach Programmes in Kenya (PDF, 156 KB) A study that followed 240 men and boys who received male circumcision services at Marie Stopes Kenya's outreach sites in eight districts in western Kenya found a low rate of side effects (1.3 percent) and high rates of client satisfaction (99 percent).

This update on efforts to scale up male circumcision for HIV prevention in 13 countries in sub-Saharan Africa was presented at the 17th Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections in San Francisco, California, USA, 16-19 February 2010.

Training Health Care Teams in Scaling-Up Male Circumcision for HIV Prevention in Africa

This report describes a 6-12 July 2009 workshop that prepared public health professionals from Israel and Senegal to work together to help provide male circumcision services and train service providers to perform the procedure in priority countries in sub-Saharan Africa.

PEPFAR Male Circumcision Partners' Meeting: Commodities and Improved Coordination of Male Circumcision for HIV Prevention

This report describes a 19-20 May 2009 meeting that brought together PEPFAR partners working in male circumcision to share experiences and recommend solutions for commodity and procurement issues that constrain male circumcision scale-up.
